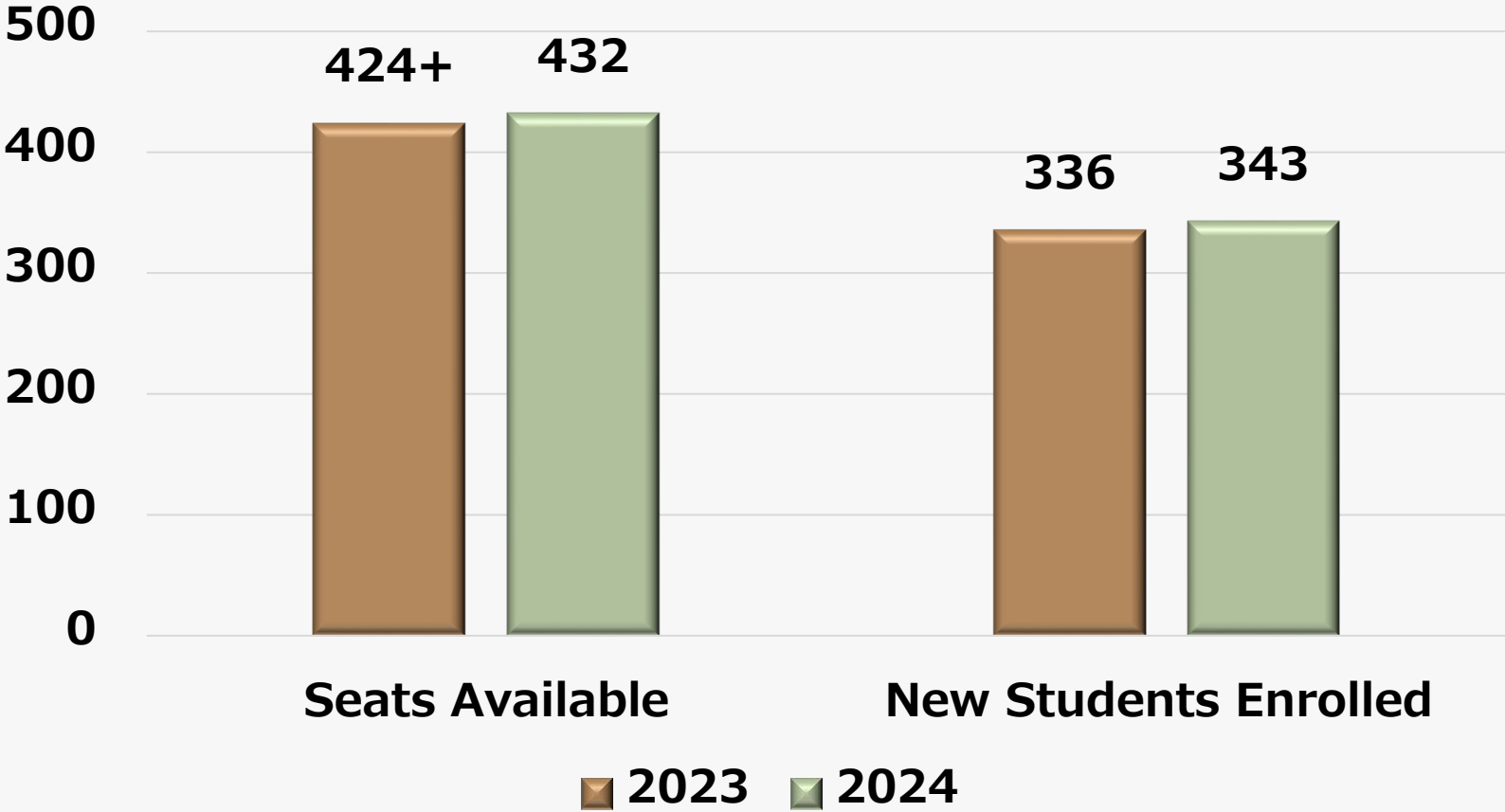

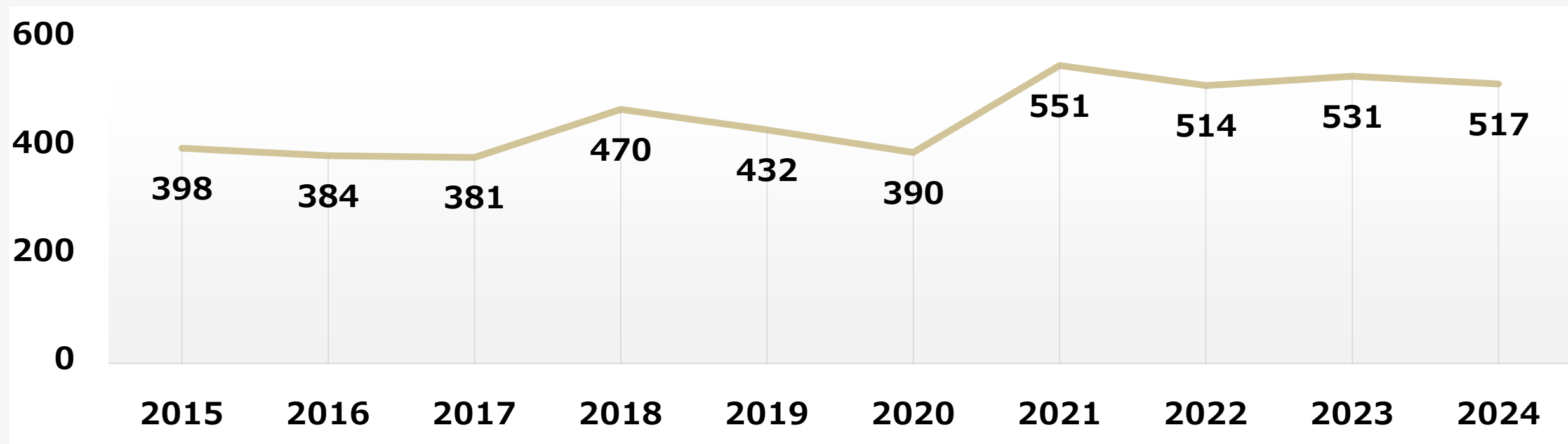

# PN Programs Total Capacity

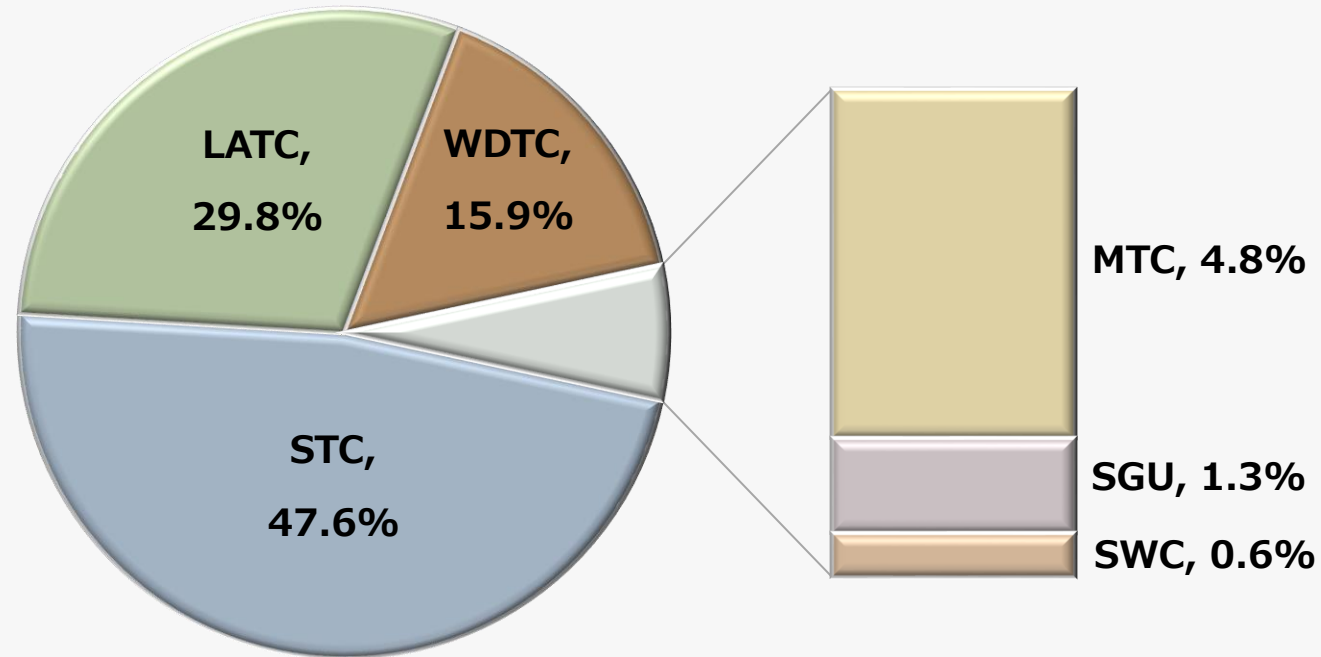

# Percent of PN Students Enrolled by Program



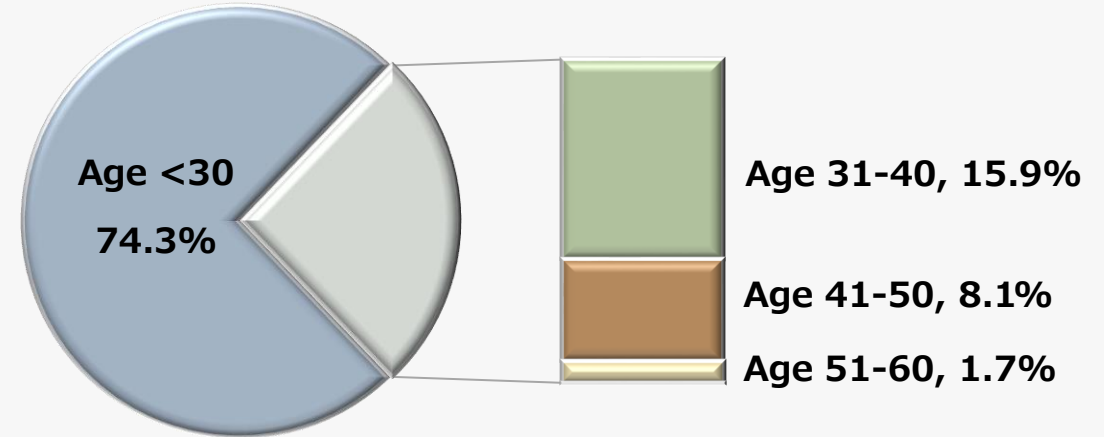

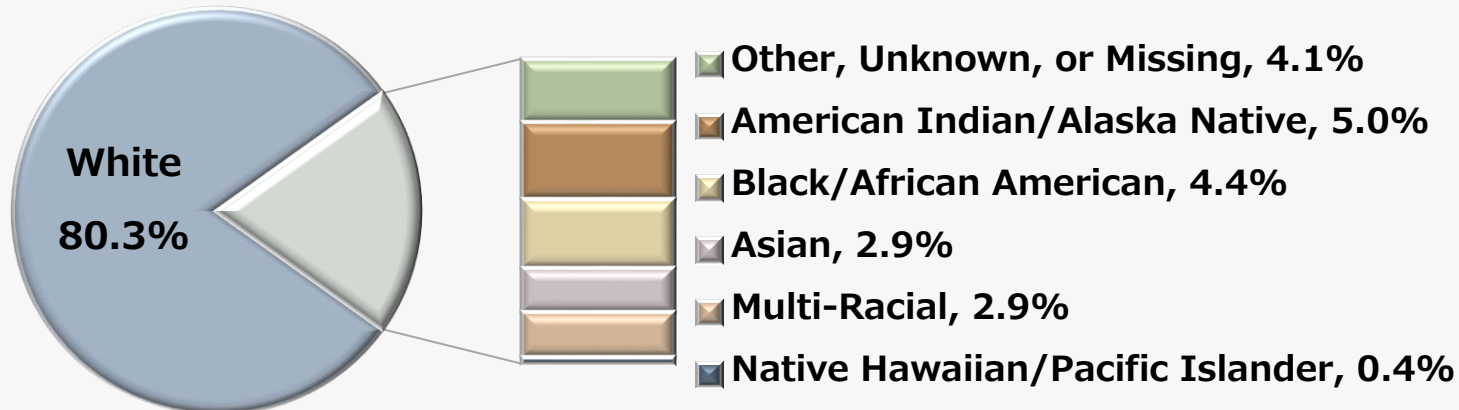

Total Graduates Licensed in SD**

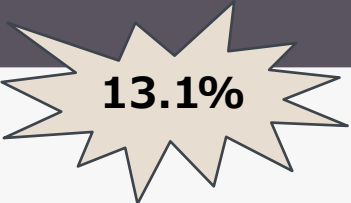

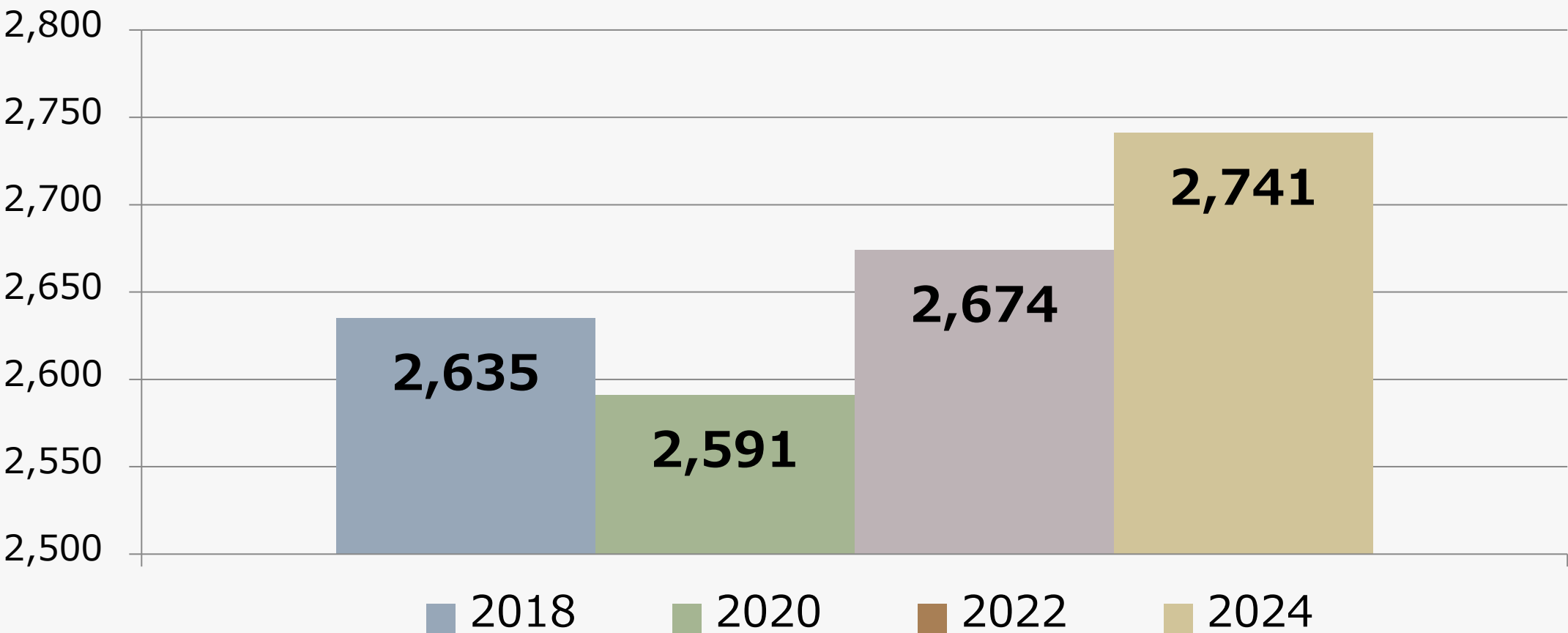

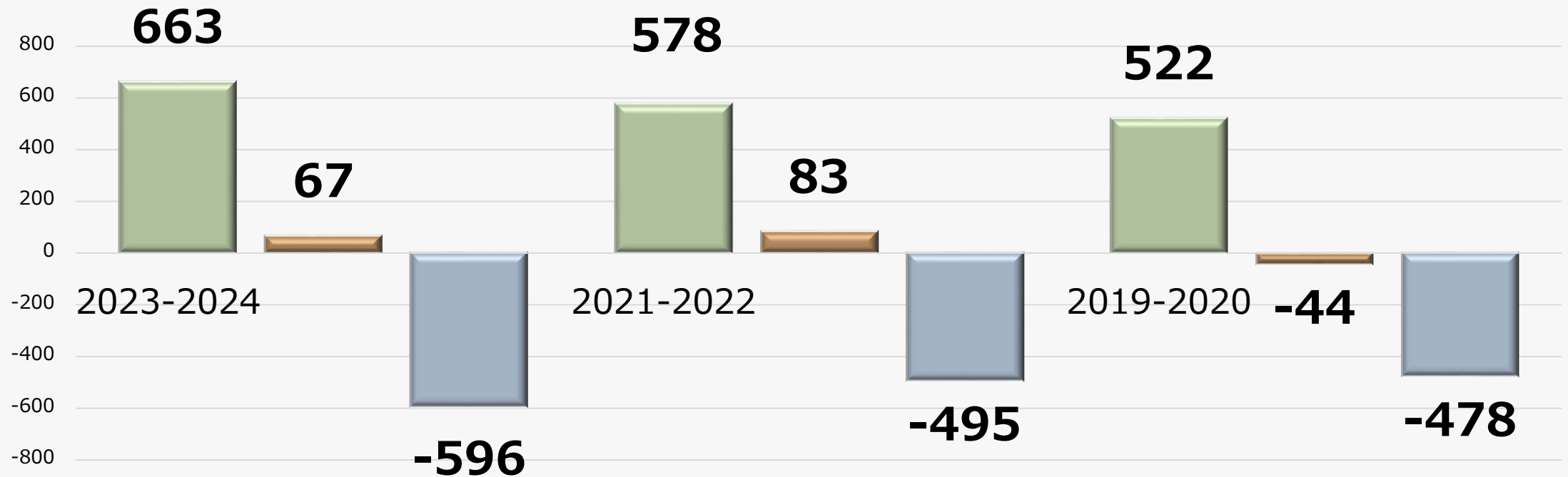
# Current Nursing Workforce

## Actively Licensed LPNs



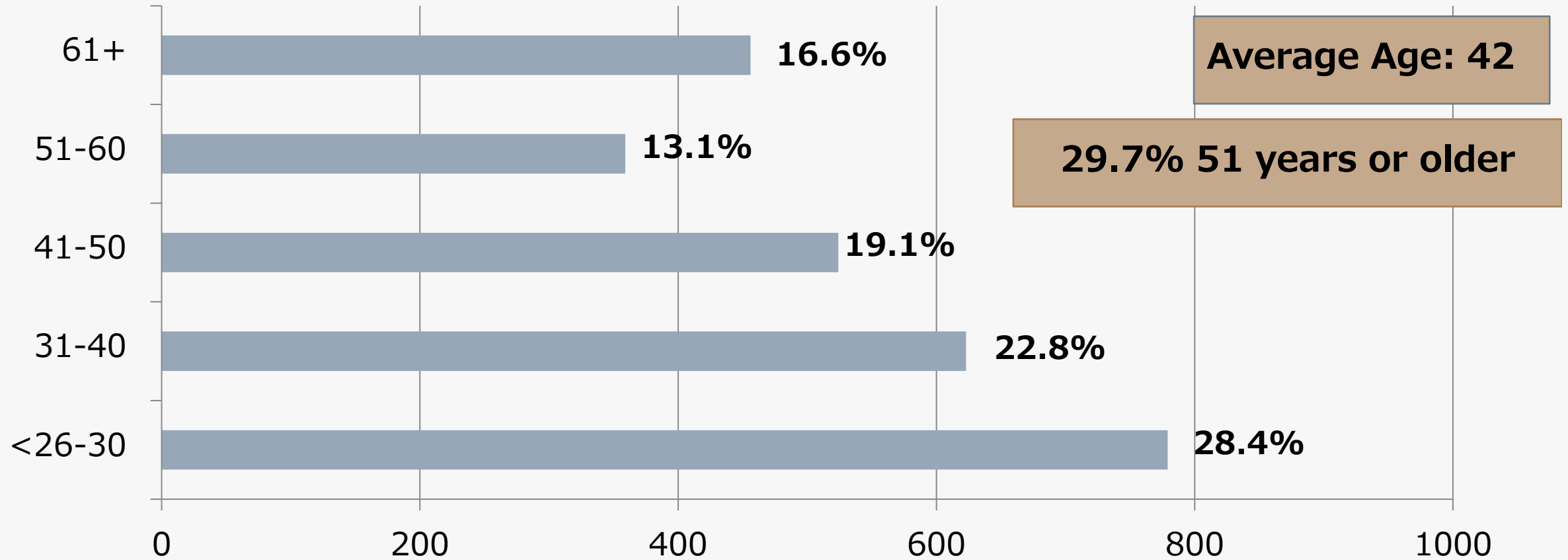


# LPN Workforce Gains and Losses

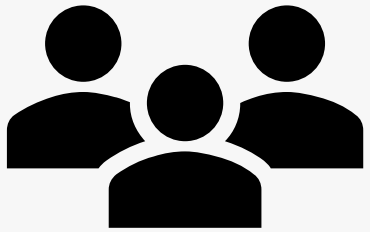

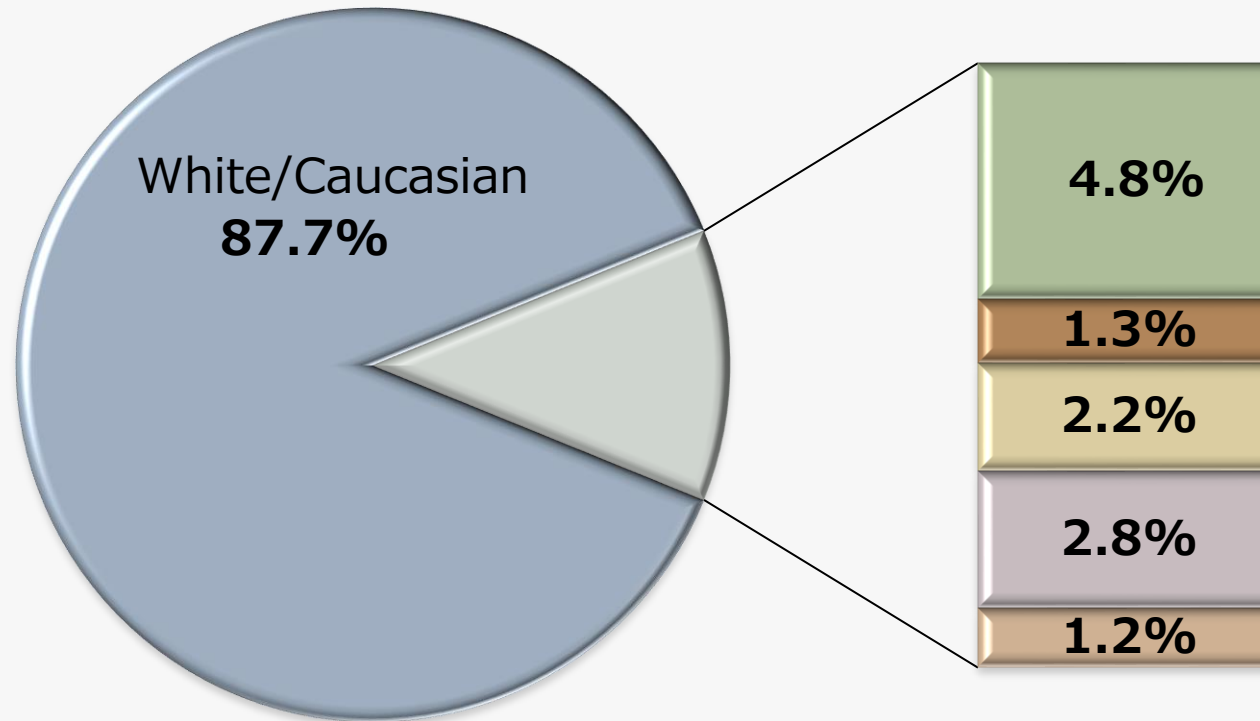

# LPN Employment: Primary State of Practice

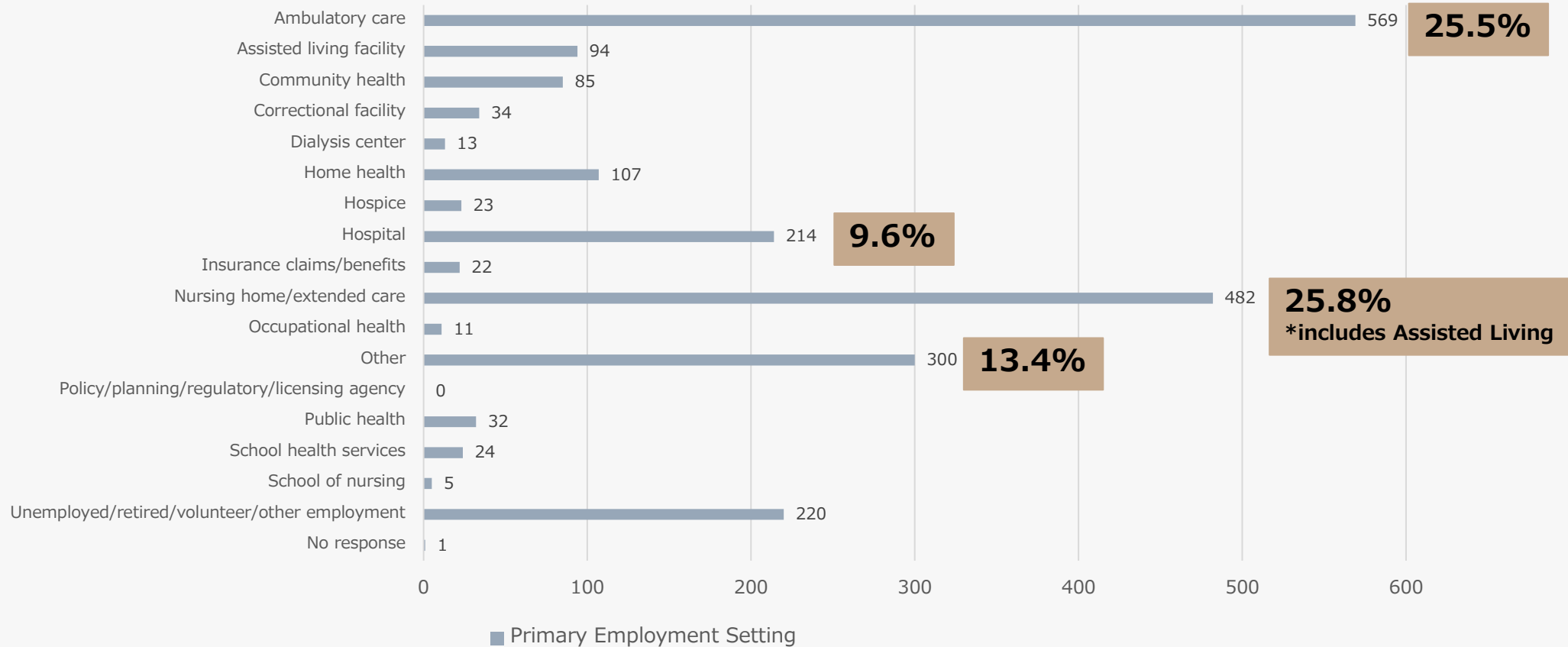

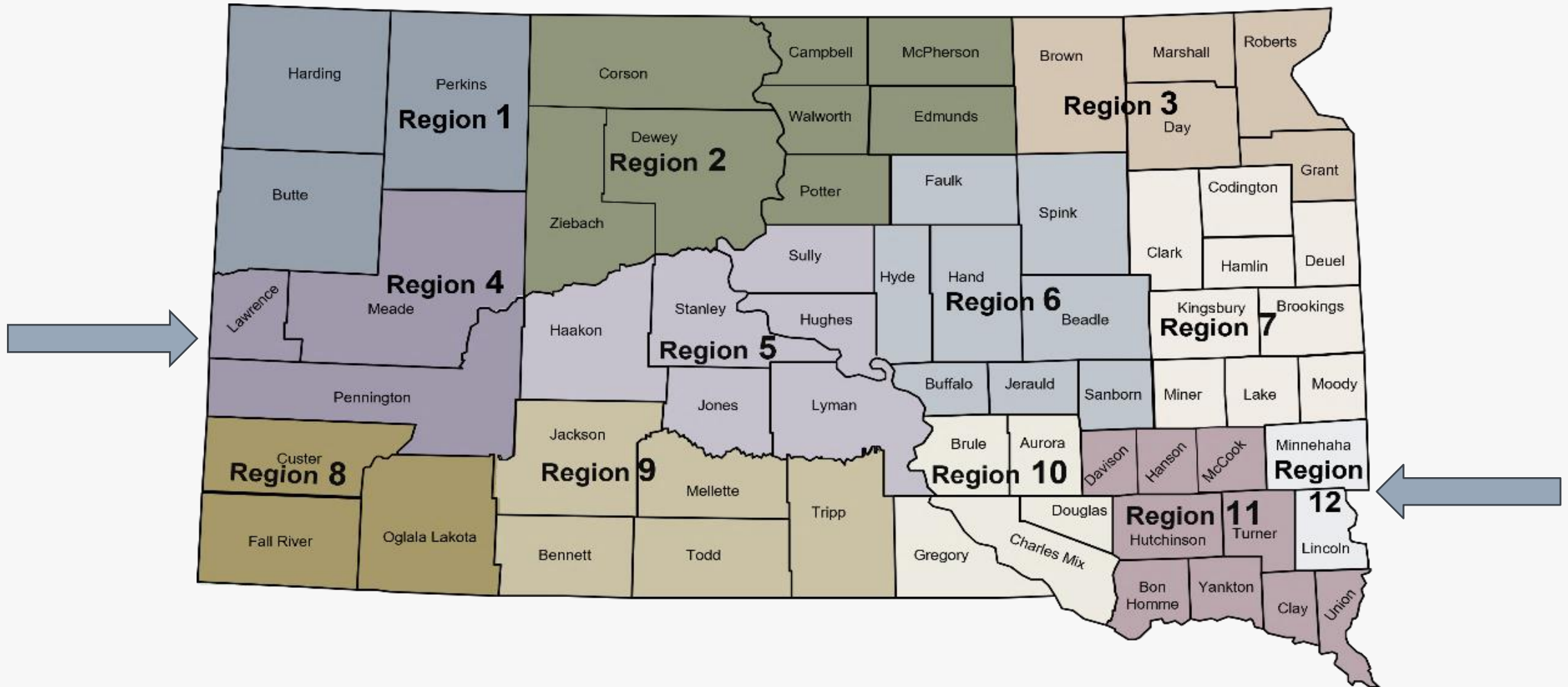

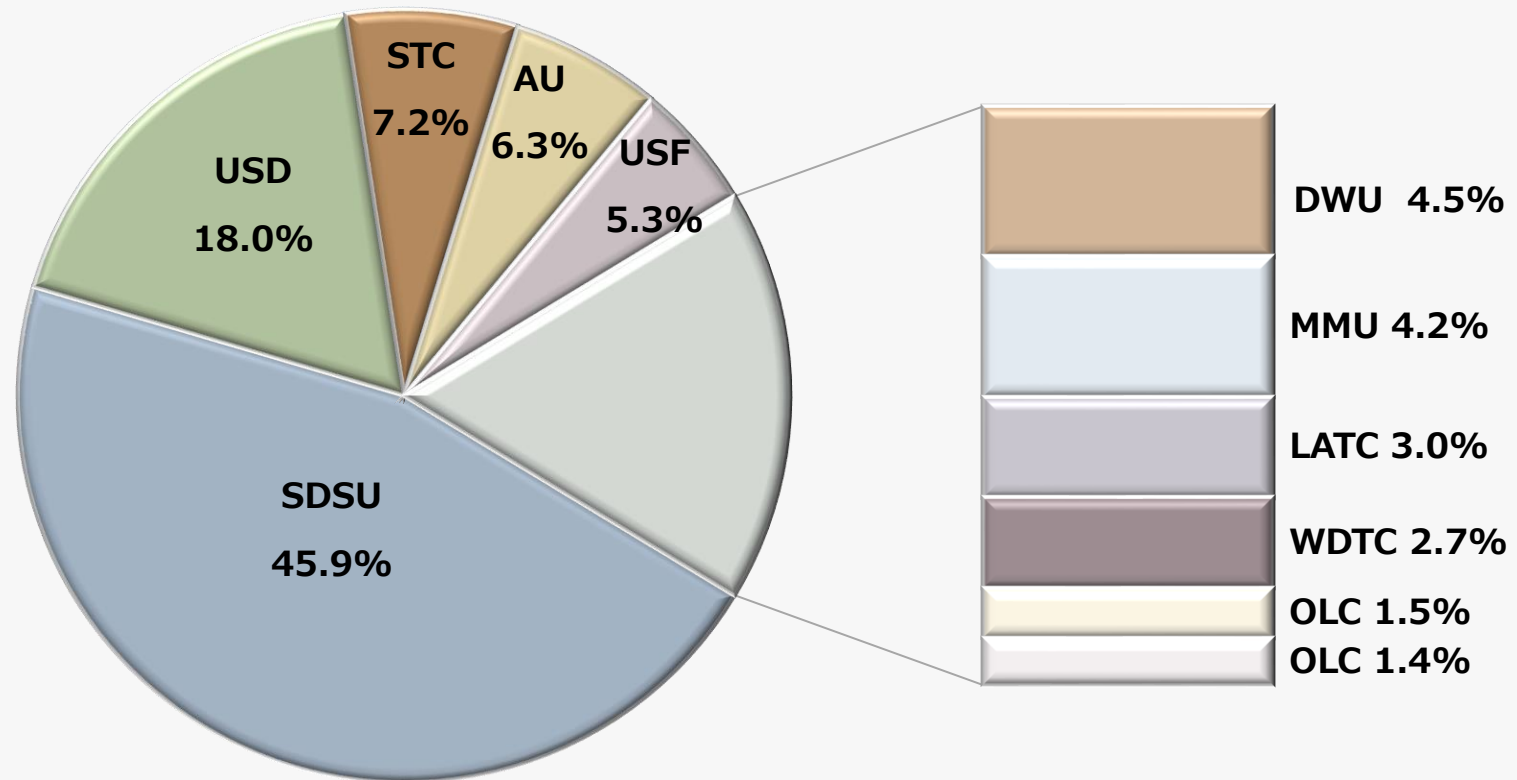
# RN Programs Total Capacity



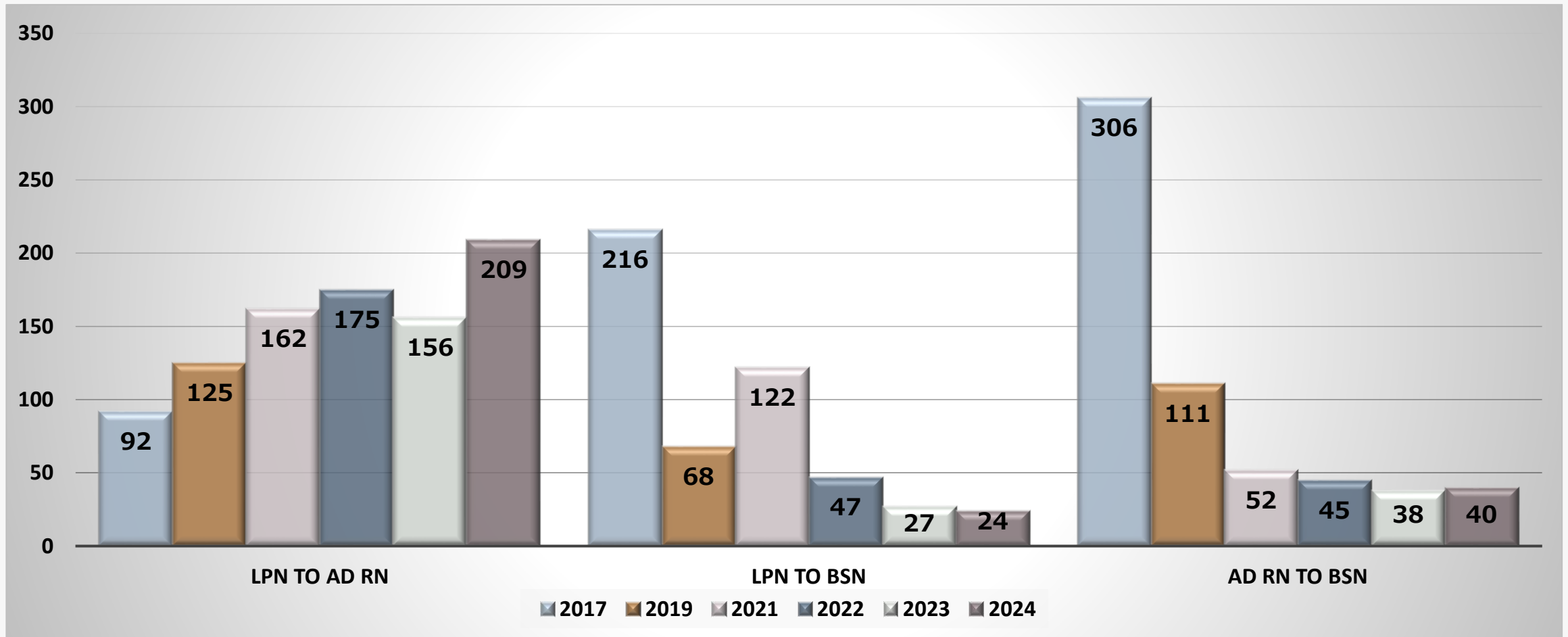
# Pre-licensure RN Program Enrollment

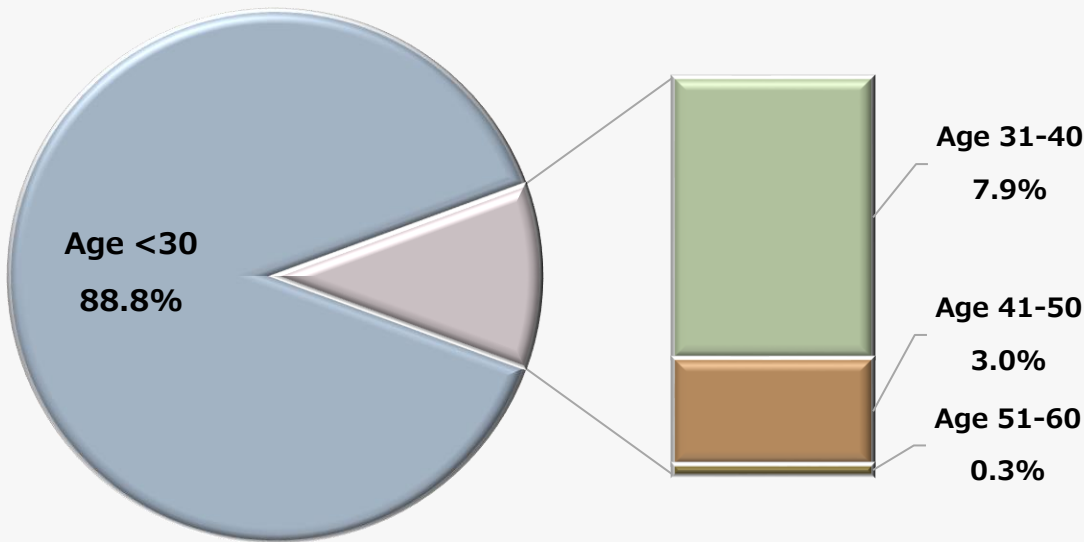

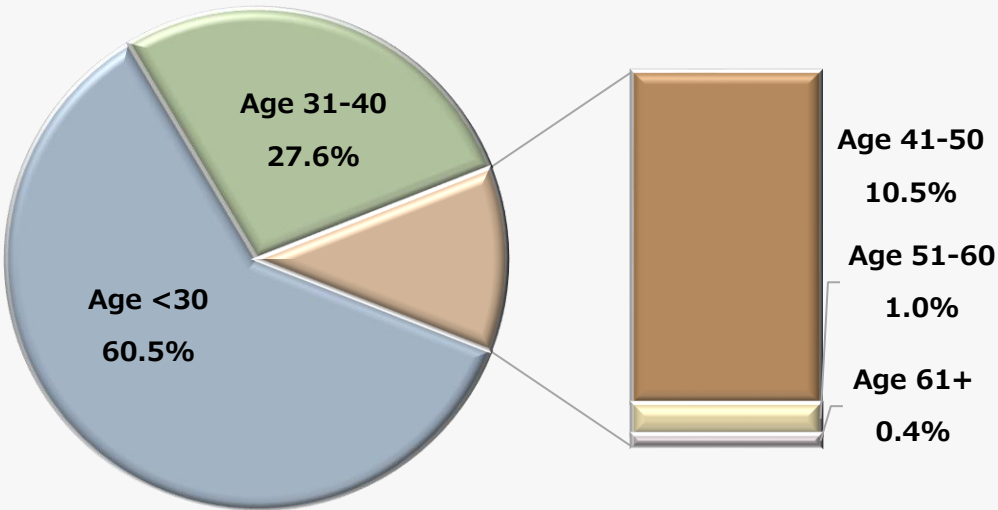

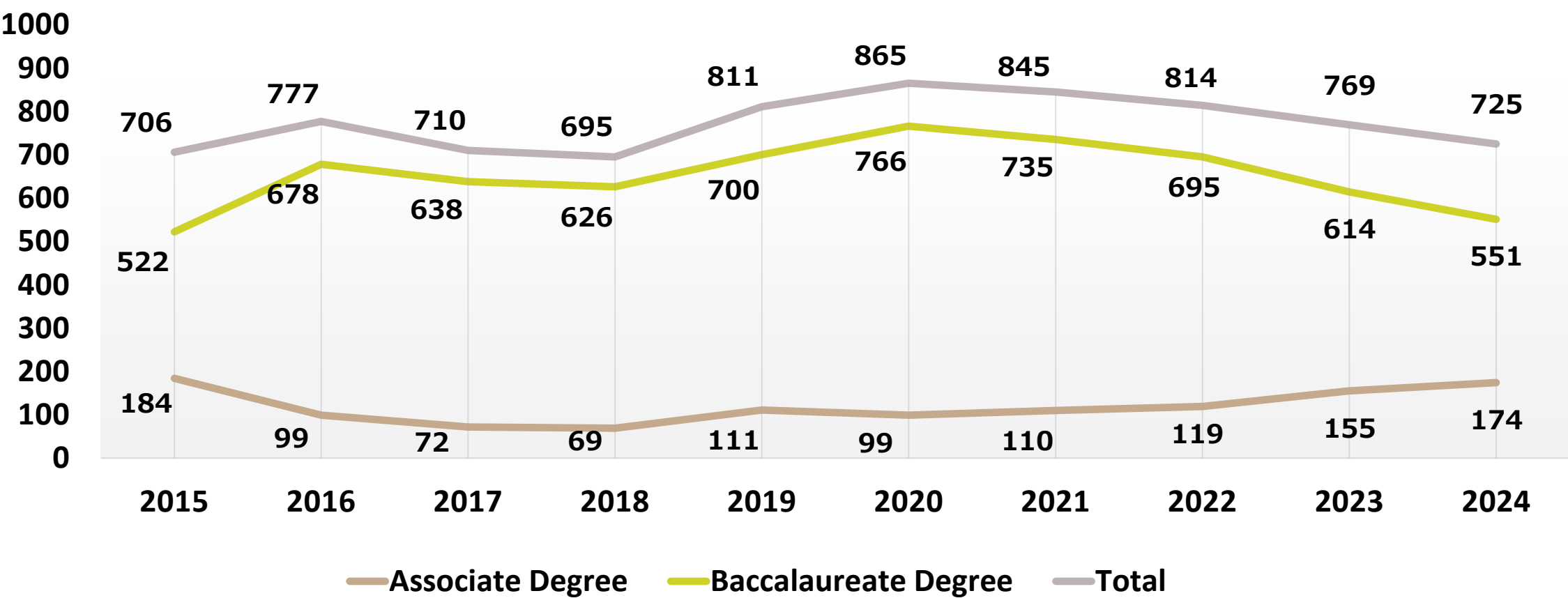

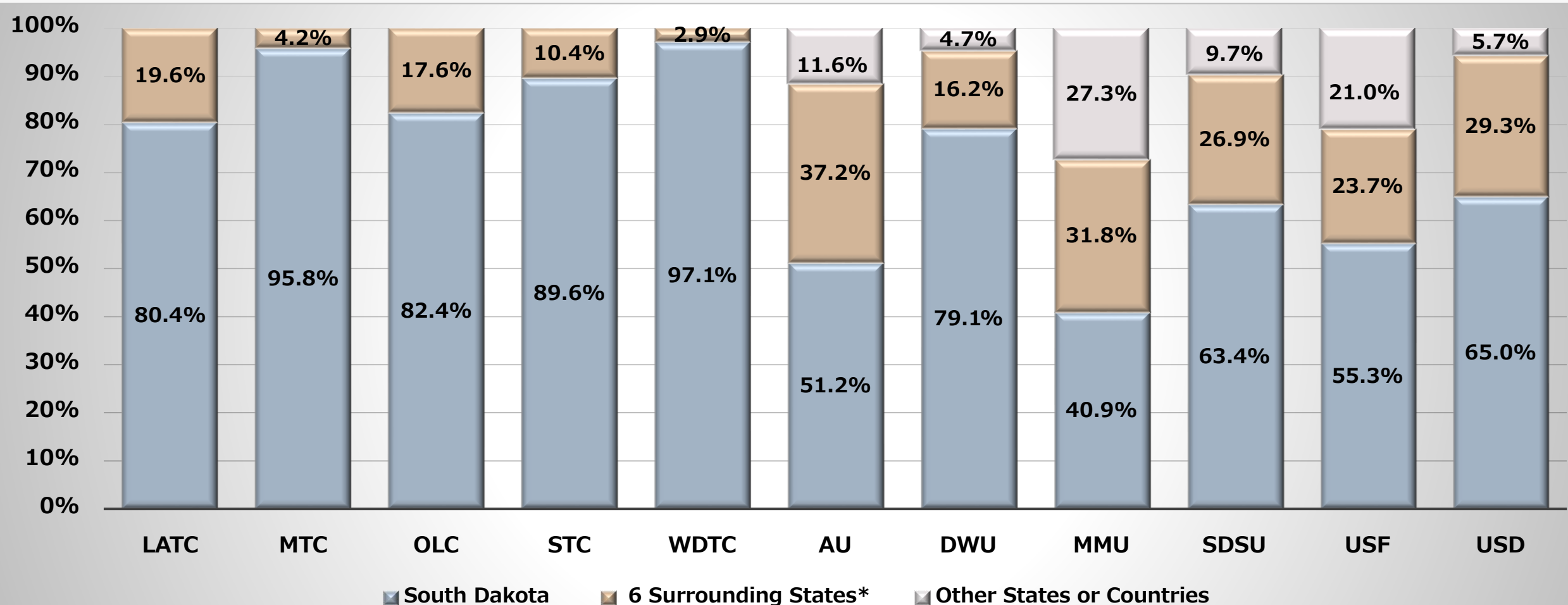
# Trends in Prelicensure RN Graduates



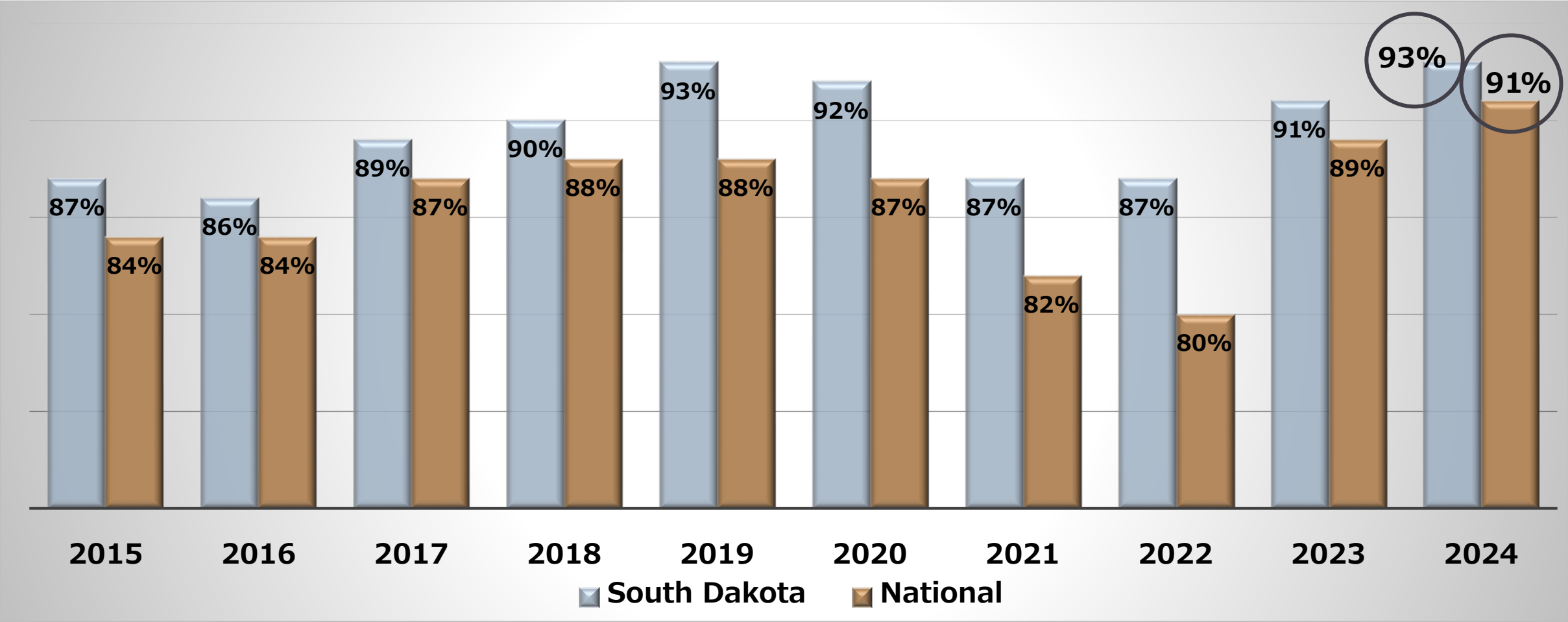

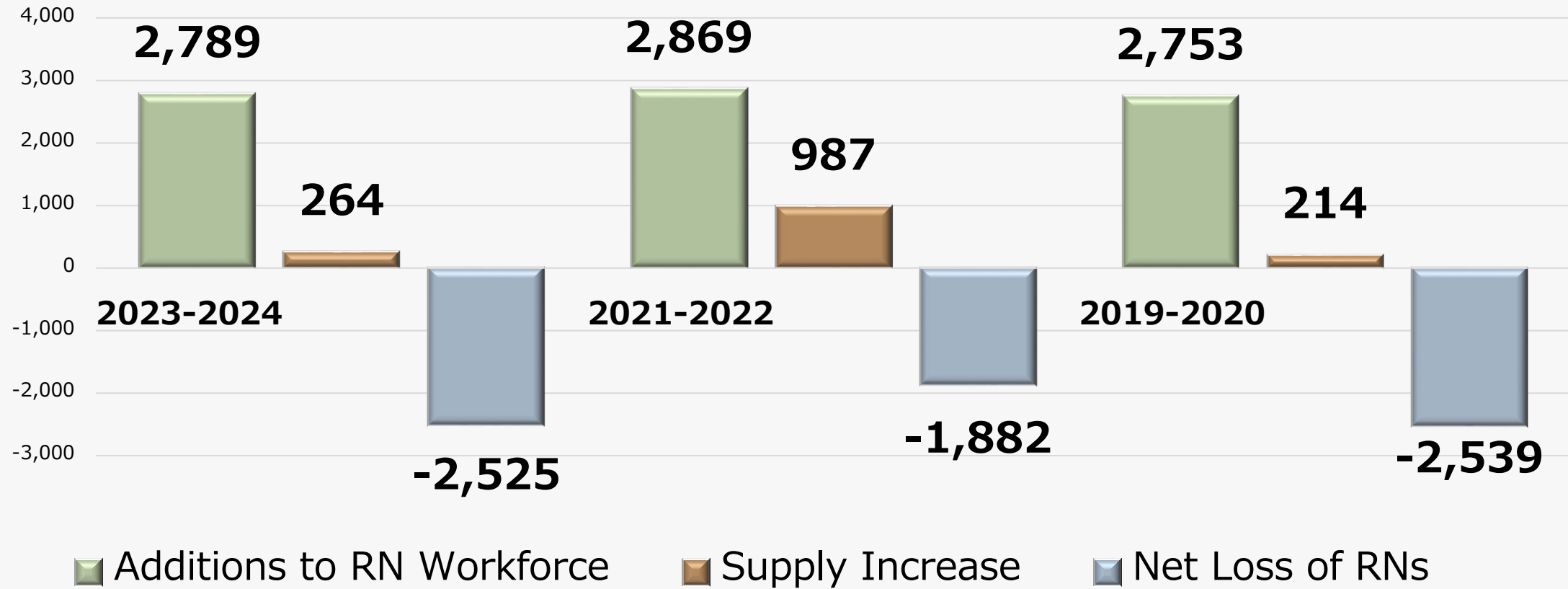

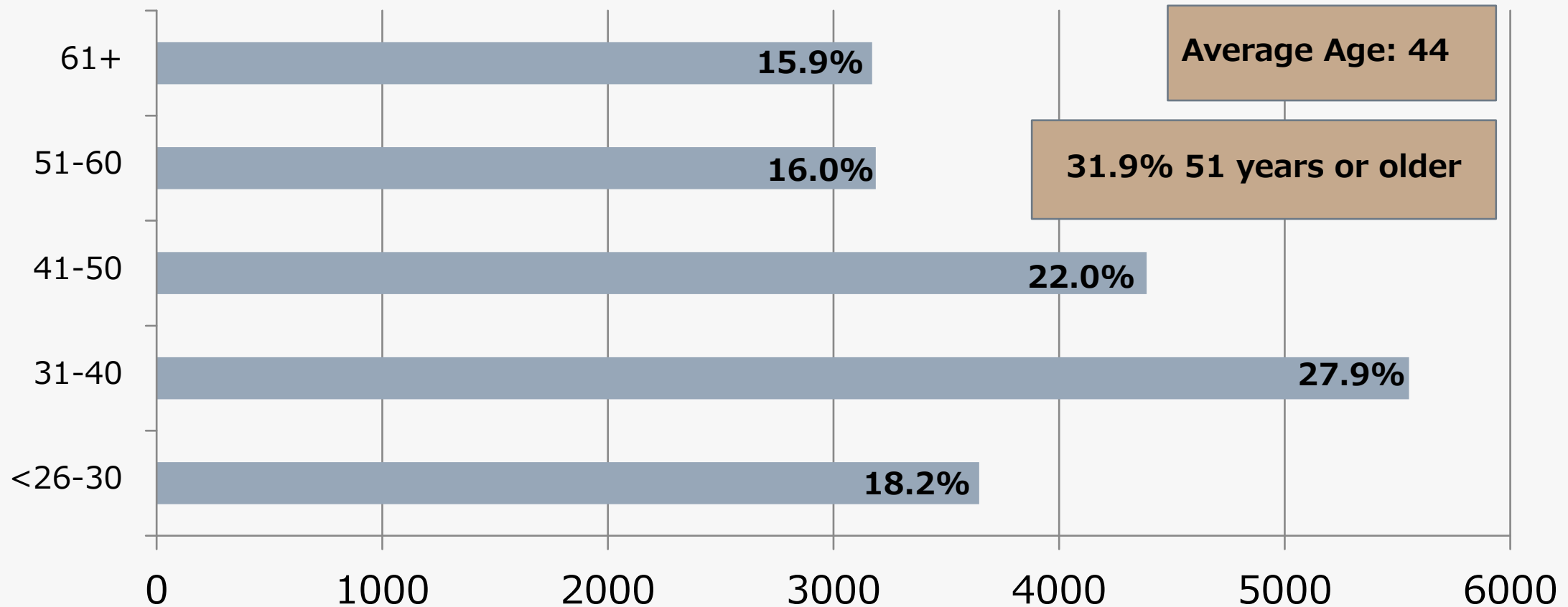

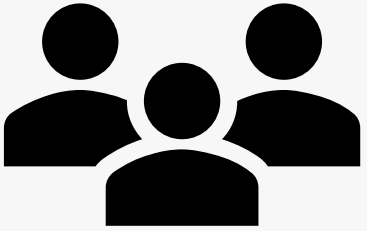
# RN Workforce Gains and Losses



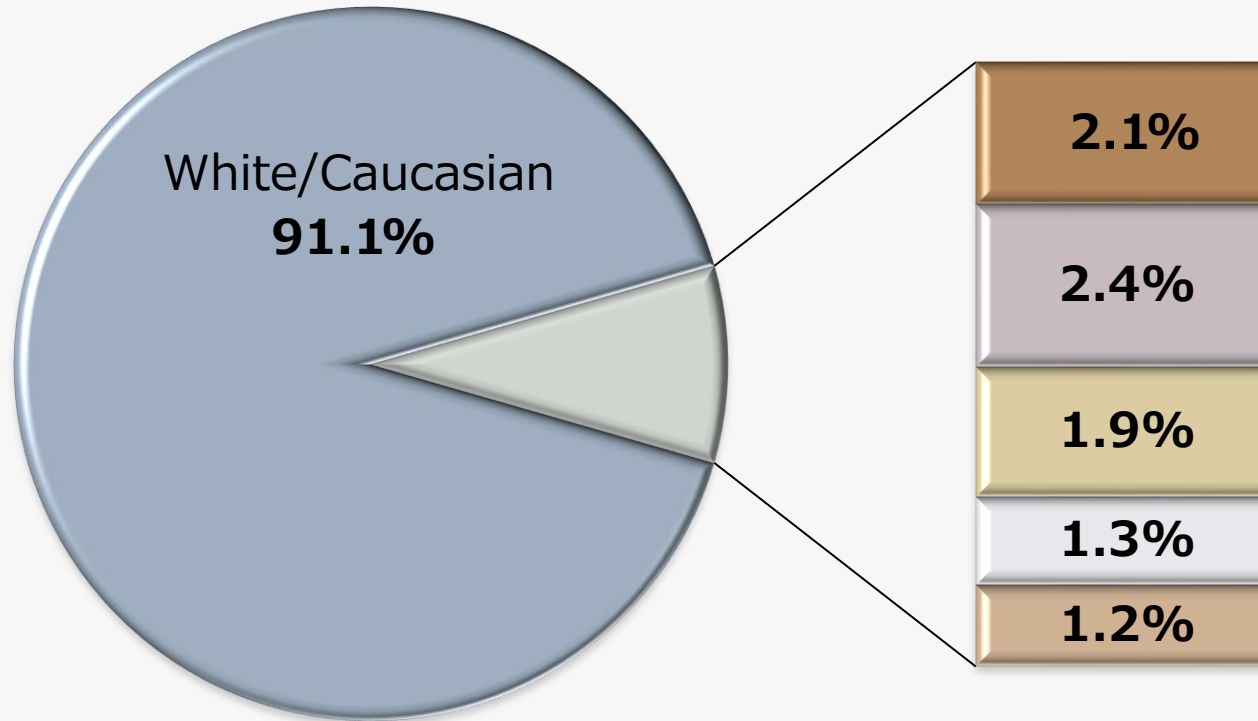

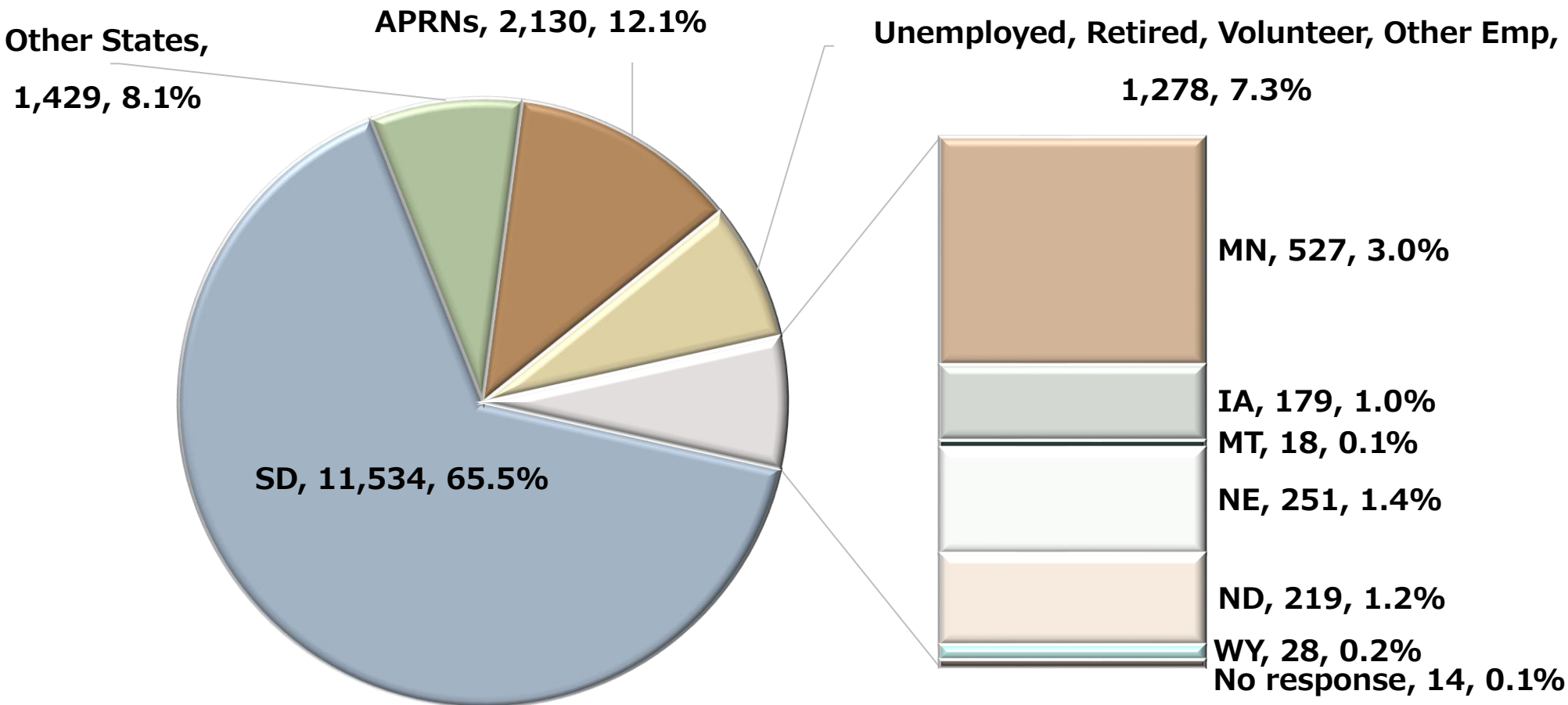

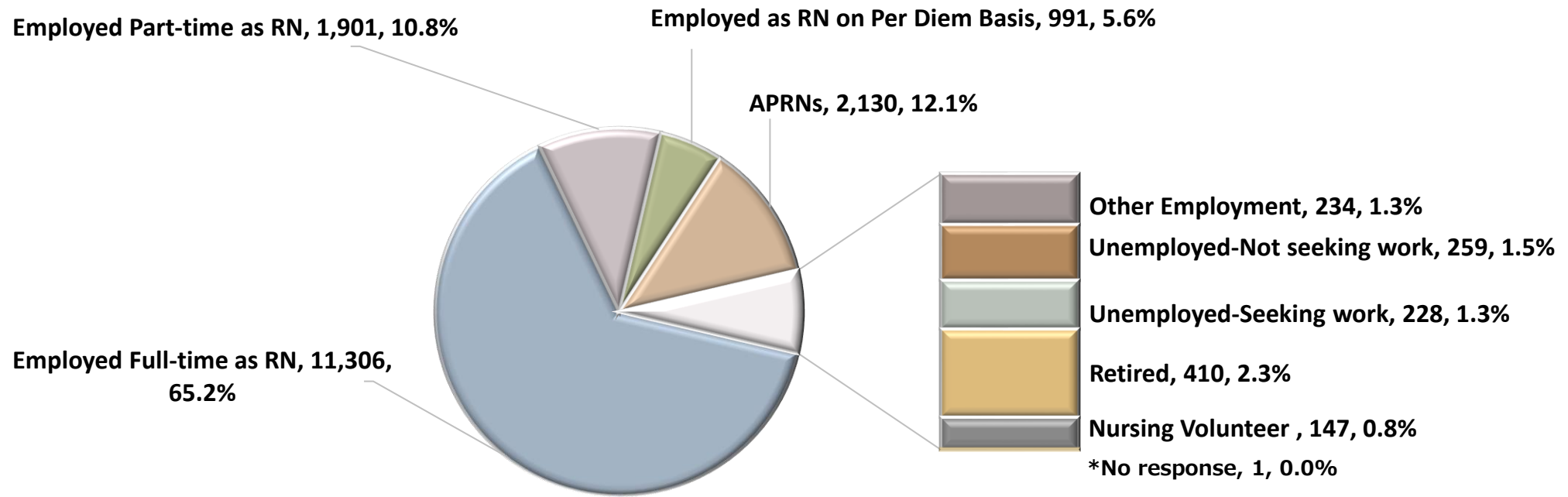

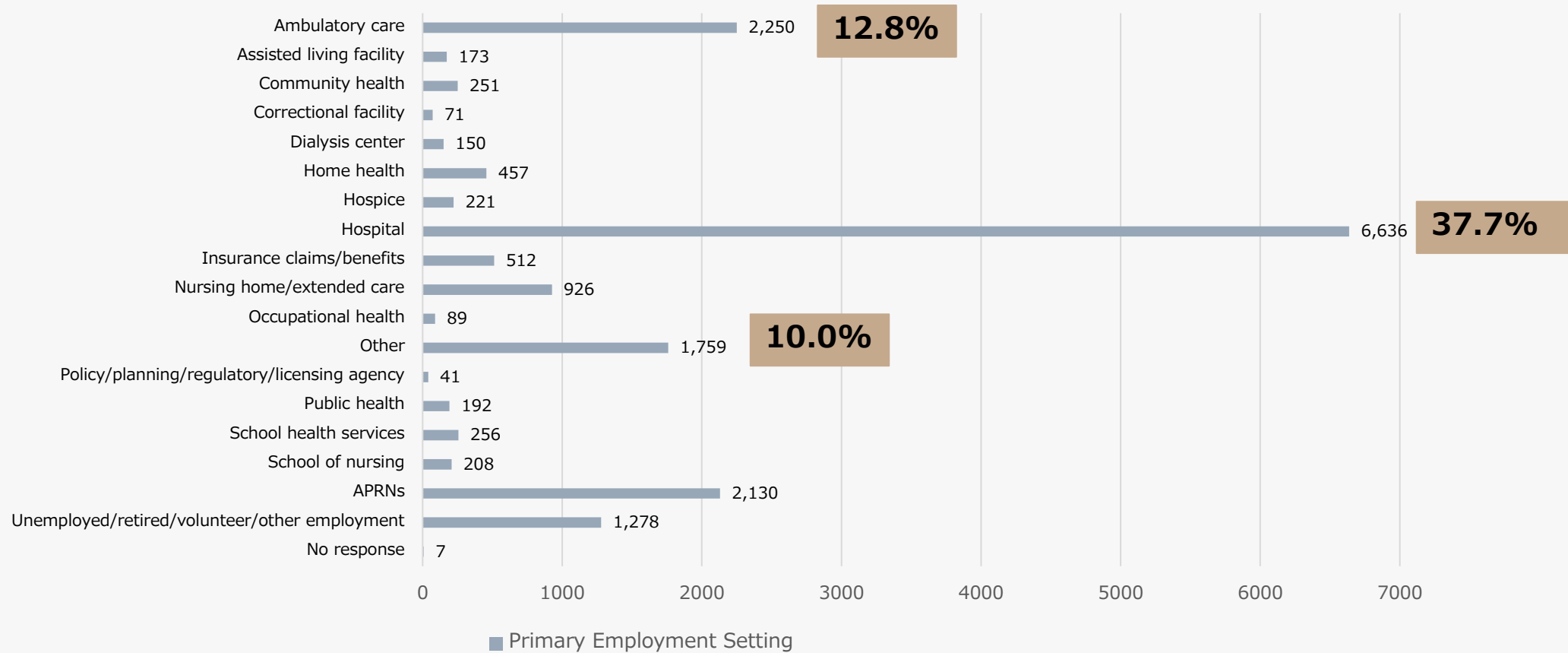
# RN Employment Status

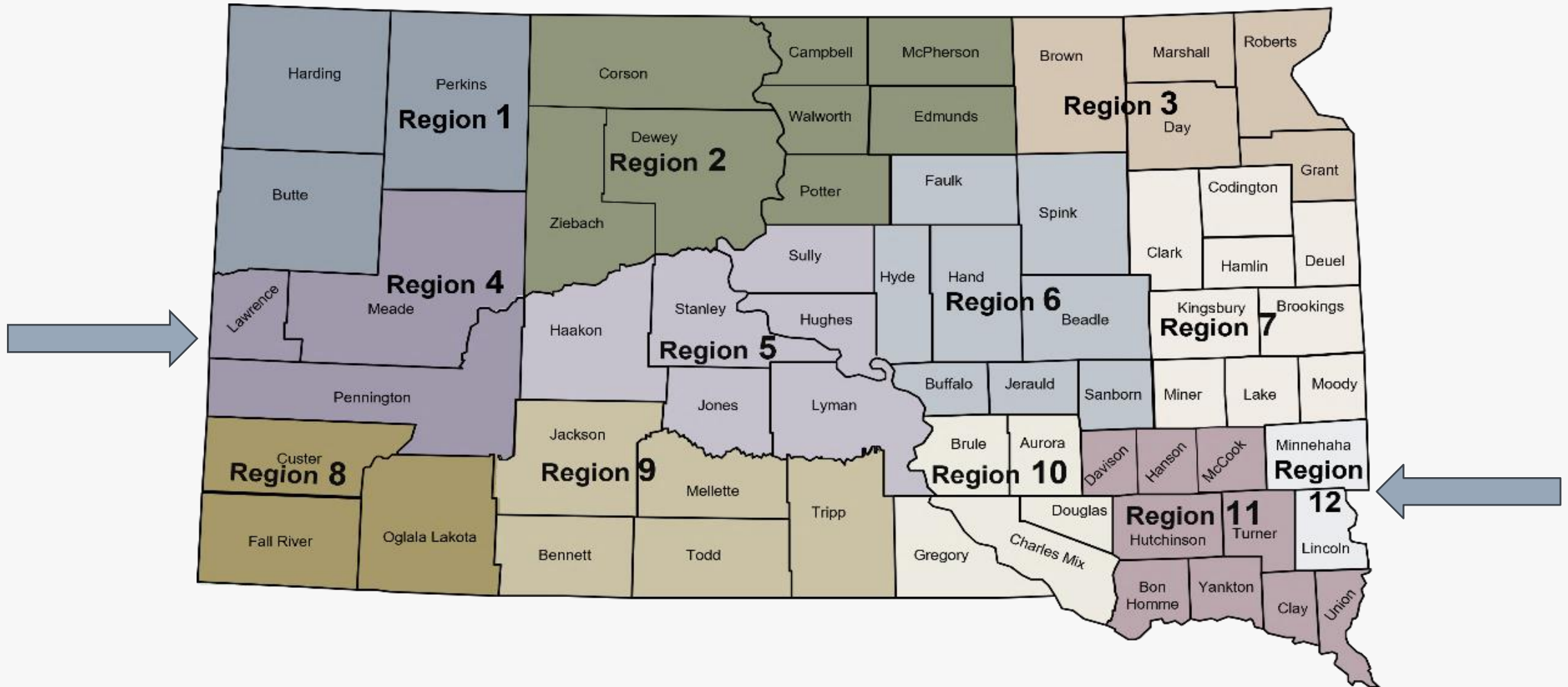


# RN Primary Employment Setting

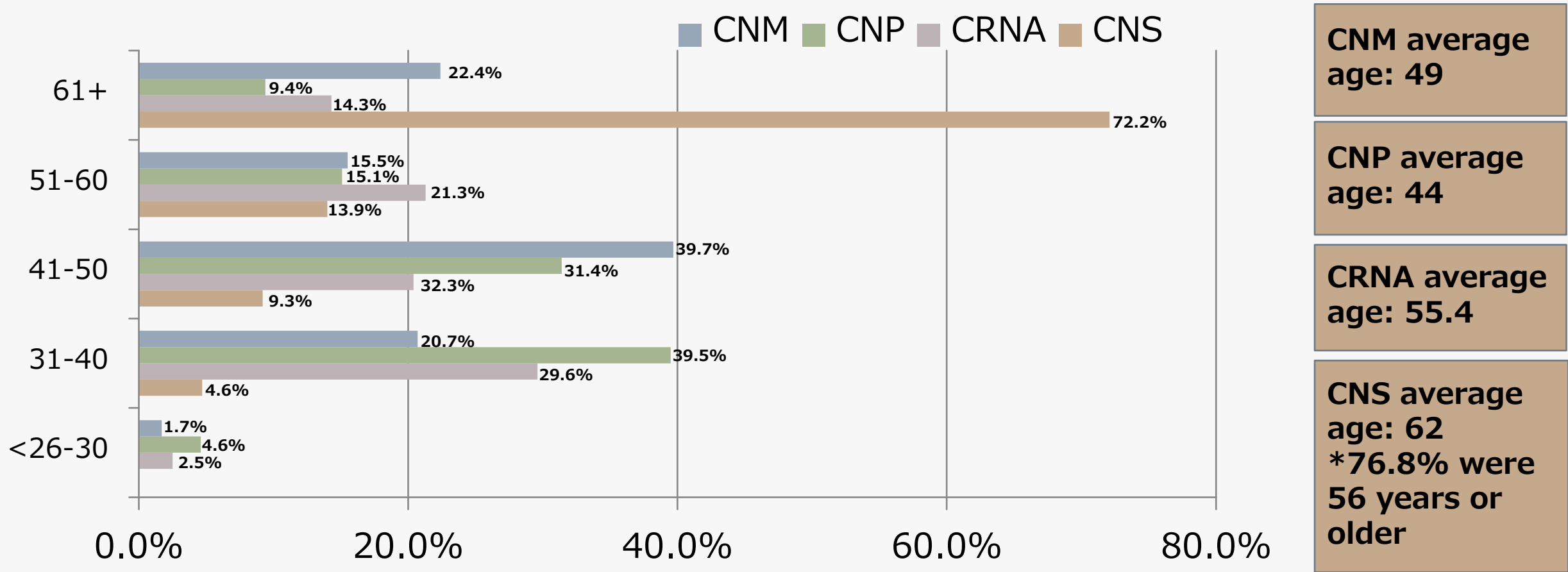

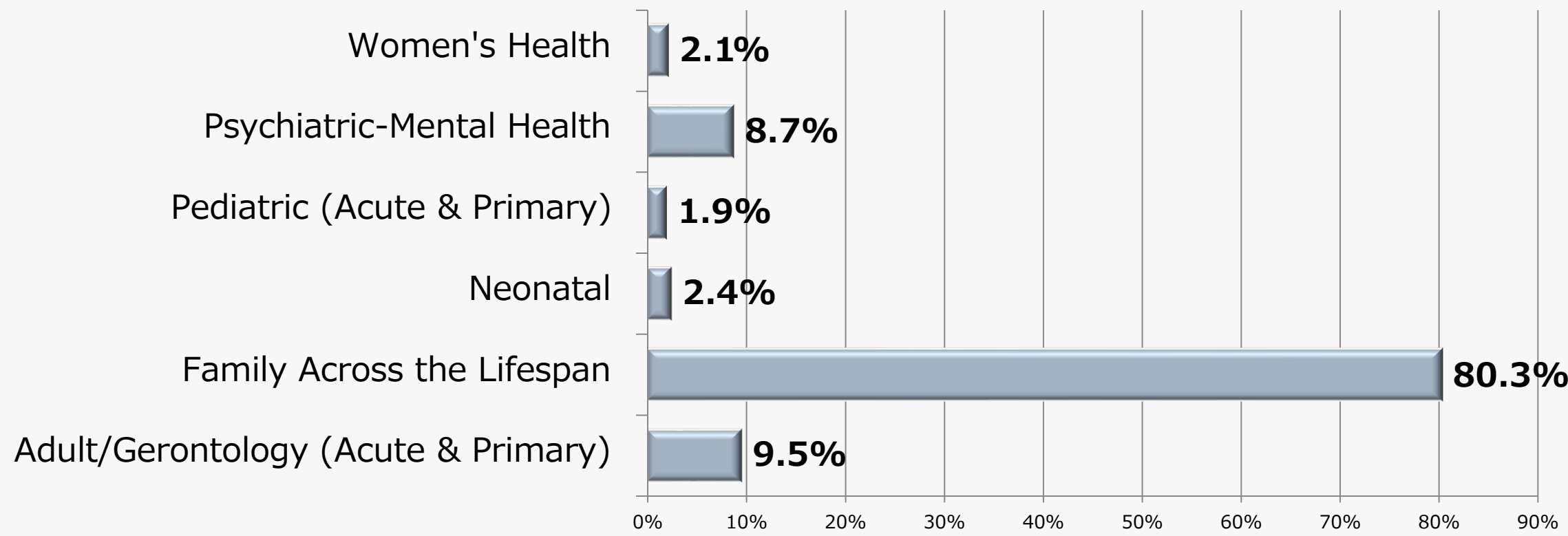

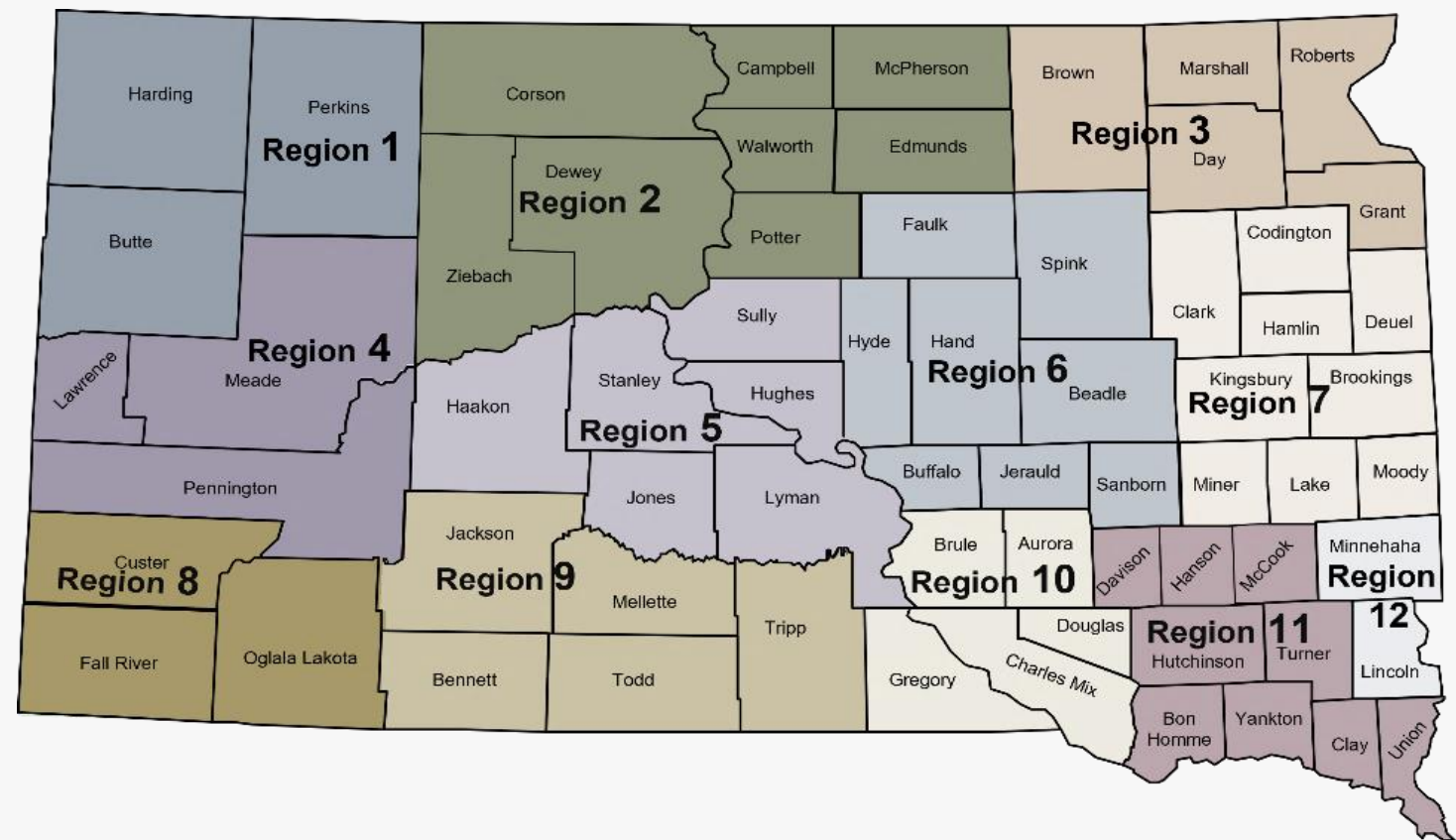
