



SOUTH DAKOTA BOARD OF NURSING

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Display of Nursing Credentials

The South Dakota Board of Nursing is authorized by the state of South Dakota, pursuant to SDCL 36-9-1.1, to safeguard life, health and the public welfare; and to protect citizens from unauthorized, unqualified and improper application of nursing practices.

The South Dakota Board of Nursing issues opinions as to what constitutes safe nursing practice. As such, an opinion is not a regulation of the Board and does not have the force and effect of law. An opinion is issued as a guideline to licensees who wish to engage in safe nursing practice, and to facilitate the delivery of safe, effective nursing care to the public.

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The Board of Nursing has received inquiries from nurses, consumers, and employers about the use of nursing credentials. The following statement is intended to promote clarity and transparency on the use of legal licensure titles and academic degrees held by nurses.

Statement

A person who holds a South Dakota nursing license, or who is practicing using a compact multistate license, shall clearly identify the legal title of the nursing license held when providing care or when advertising services to South Dakota residents. The nurse shall use and display the legal title, or abbreviation of the title, of the license held.

1. The following licensure titles shall be used or displayed:
 - Licensed practical nurse, abbreviated "LPN"
 - Registered nurse, abbreviated "RN"
 - Certified nurse midwife, abbreviated "CNM"
 - Certified nurse practitioner, abbreviated "CNP"
 - Certified registered nurse anesthetist, abbreviated "CRNA"
 - Clinical nurse specialist, abbreviated "CNS"
2. A CNM, CNP, CRNA, and CNS may add the title "advanced practice registered nurse", abbreviated "APRN".
3. A licensed nurse may add earned or awarded education degree(s), title of doctor, or certification title(s).

Examples of how a nurse should display titles:

- Mary Smith, LPN
- Mary Smith, RN, BSN
- Mary Smith, CNM, APRN
- Mary Smith, RN, PhD
- Dr. Mary Smith, CNP, DNP, FNP-BC
